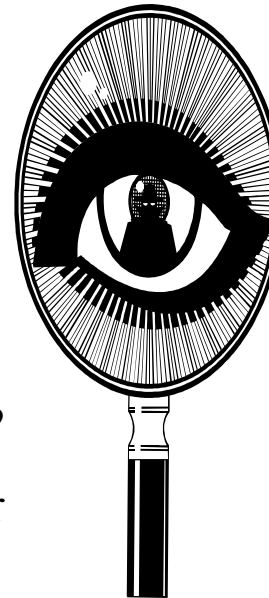

Due to the Canadian Hazardous Product Act we can no longer receive the following items:

- 1) Baby furniture, accessories and equipment (Stroller's, car seats, cribs, play pens, etc.)
- 2) Lawn darts
- 3) Chemicals of any kind
- 4) Paint
- 5) Helmets and face protectors
- 6) Any appliances larger than a microwave or that contain gas, propane, freon
- 7) Mattresses and box springs
- 8) Blinds
- 9) Ski or snowboard equipment
- 10) Any television older than 5 years

Under the Environmental Protection Enhancement Act Violators are subject to a

\$250 fine
